Dear Parents and Guardians,



A very insightful bishop in the 1600's discussed our reluctance to accept the fact that God loves us unconditionally. In a world where we love people for an assortment of reasons- if they are kind to us, if they are talented, if they are just, if they are pretty, etc., it is difficult to imagine someone who loves us no matter what we are or do. The bishop explained that our capacity to love God with our whole heart is dependent upon our ability to accept that he loves us unconditionally, and wholeheartedly. Pope Francis also addresses this idea when he explains that there is no sin we could commit that will keep God from loving us.

Mindfulness affords us an excellent opportunity to spend time reflecting on both our heart and mind and making peace with ourselves and with God. Make time to consider your soul and forgive yourself for things you find deficient; look into your mind and know that God loves you unconditionally.

As we mindfully reflect on Catholic Schools Week, we recognize the time and effort spent to share our light with everyone. We celebrate the beauty of a school which centers itself on Christ and a community who is expected to go forth and "Share this light" with the world. As our readings tell us today, people are watching us as representatives of Christ and as such we must "remove from (our) midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech" (Isaiah 58: 6-11). May our light shine brightly and illuminate the world at every point where we connect with it. Spread the Word...Holy Rosary shines brighter than all! May God Bless you all.

Letter from The Governing Board of Pastors

Fr. Lewandowski—Pastor of St. Titus Parish

Dear Teachers, Staff, Students and Friends of Holy Rosary School,

Praised be Jesus Christ—now and forever!

Congratulations! You have almost lived long enough to experience February of 2017. Why is that significant you ask? Well, you will experience something that will not happen again for another 843 years, (Yes—that's 8 <u>hundred</u> and 43 years!). In this February, there will be "4" Sundays, 4 Mondays, 4 Tuesdays, 4 Wednesdays, 4 Thursdays, 4 Fridays and 4 Saturdays. I'm pretty confident that none of us will be alive to experience that phenomenon again.

Lent, also, will not begin during this February. Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent) falls on March 1st.

The United States, as always, will celebrate February 14th as St. Valentine's Day. The Catholic Church, however, will <u>not</u>. On February 14th, the Catholic Church celebrates the feast day of St. Cyril and St. Methodius. (I "seriously" doubt that you'll find a "St. Cyril and St. Methodius" Day card in the Hallmark card stores.) They were brothers who lived in the 800s. They were of Slavic descent and were considered to be a "spiritual bridge between Eastern and Western traditions".

Probably the most significant event that we as Catholics celebrate during February is the feast day of the "Presentation of the Lord" on February 2nd. (In the United States, unfortunately, that same day is celebrated as "Ground Hog" day. If the ground hog sees or doesn't see his "shadow" is supposed to determine how much longer we will experience "winter". (Regardless, none the less, winter ends and spring begins on the same day each year!).

The feast of the Presentation of the Lord is the day that Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to the temple in Jerusalem as an infant to offer him up to God. In thanksgiving, Mary and Joseph offered 2 turtle doves (pigeons) for the gift of Jesus (see the beginning of St. Luke's Gospel for the full story).

In some cultures (Polish, Slovak, etc.), this feast of the Presentation of the Lord is considered the "end" of the Christmas season. Some of them actually keep their Christmas trees and decorations up until February 2nd. After this feast day, we really don't hear anything about Jesus until He is 12 years old and found teaching and asking questions of the Scribes and Rabbis in the temple. Then, we don't hear about Jesus until He begins His public ministry at the age of 30. During those years, it is believed that St. Joseph died and that Jesus continued to work in the carpentry shop.

So, congratulations again for living in a historic time in the world. May God's blessings continue to come upon you during this month and always. And, may His spirit always fill your hearts with the love for Jesus shown in the hearts of Mary and Joseph.



Tuition Assistance Opportunities for Holy Rosary Families



There are several sources of tuition assistance available to Holy Rosary families. These opportunities are made possible through the generous support of various businesses and foundations. A number of these opportunities require interested families to go through an outside application process. Other opportunities become available because of direct donations to Holy Rosary from generous parishioners of affiliated parishes.

The available opportunities and related application processes are outlined below. In cases in which Holy Rosary decides who the recipients will be, Holy Rosary will only consider families that have completed the application process for all funding sources for which they would qualify. Any cases of extraordinary or unforeseen circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

EITC & OSTC FUNDS

Much of the available tuition assistance is made possible through **Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC)** and **Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC)** business donations to non-profit organizations interested in promoting education. To be eligible for EITC or OSTC funding for the 2017-2018 school year the adjusted gross income for a family with one dependent must be \$91,620 or less. For each additional dependent, the adjusted gross income threshold increases \$15,270 per child. Below is a listing of the organizations that provide EITC & OSTC funding to Holy Rosary students and an explanation of how to apply for funding from each organization. Please note: all eligible families do not necessarily receive funding. Awards are dependent on the amount of scholarship money available each year.

Business Leadership Organized for Catholic Schools (BLOCS) is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping families afford Catholic education. Holy Rosary students received almost \$32,000.00 in BLOCS funding during the 2016-2017 school year.

Application is available by going to <u>www.smartaidforparents.com</u> school code is 12730. Deadline is March 31. Early applications are strongly suggested.

Tuition Assistance for Holy Rosary Families

The Bridge Foundation is an independent non-profit organization that provides scholarship opportunities to Pennsylvania low-income families. Families must apply directly to the Bridge Foundation between May 1st and June 30th each year. Applications are only accepted during this window. Applications are available online at www.bridgeedu.org. Families who receive Bridge funding must complete a 40-hour community service requirement.

The Henkels Foundation supports benevolent, religious, educational, charitable, scientific, and literary undertakings throughout the United States.

If funds become available through the Foundation, Holy Rosary determines how to distribute the funding. Only families that have completed the BLOCS application, and who meet the eligibility requirements for EITC funding, will be considered for available Henkels funds.

Other Funding Sources

The Kremer Foundation provides Catholic elementary schools with tuition grants for children from financially challenged families. The Foundation's grants are given directly to the schools; school principals select which students receive the tuition assistance. Holy Rosary received \$10,250 from the Kremer Foundation for the 2014-2015 school year.

To qualify for assistance, a family's adjusted gross income cannot exceed the federal food program's maximum family income for reduced priced meals. The 2016-2017 guidelines are not yet available. To qualify for the 2017-2018 school year, a family of four's adjusted gross income had to be less than \$44,863; the qualifying amount was increased by \$7,696 for each additional family member.

If Holy Rosary receives a grant from the Kremer Foundation for the 2017-2018 school year, Holy Rosary will notify families of the application process in the spring. All applications will be submitted to Holy Rosary.

- YOUR APPLICATION WILL NOT BE COMPLETED OR CONSIDERED UNTIL **AFTER** YOU SUBMIT YOUR 2016 TAXES. YOU MAY OR MAY NOT BE CONTACTED BY SMART AID ABOUT THE STATUS OF YOUR APPLICATION AND/OR ABOUT MISSING DOCUMENTS THAT NEED TO ACCOMPANY YOURAPPLICATION. MAKE SURE YOU LOG ON TO YOUR ACCOUNT ONCE YOU HAVE COMPLETED YOUR 2016 TAXES TO FINISH YOUR APPLICATION
