Dear Parents and Guardians.

Well Advent is upon us! I remember in the not so distant past, being in a school where the pastor prohibited any Christmas decorations or celebrations of any kind until after December 25th. Clearly, this was not what I was accustomed to and balked at the very thought if it.

However in retrospect, that was probably the most fulfilling Advent I have had to date.



Our only focus was on preparation for the coming of Christ!

As I sat in mass today, I listened to the priest discuss how we must "conceive" the birth of Jesus and determine what we are expecting/ hoping for at the delivery. What is our hope for December 25th? What impact does the birth of our Savior have on us and how do we prepare for that impact?

We can begin by trying to imagine the journey of those who lived it....

Can we conceive of a fourteen year old girl being told by an angel that she was to carry the Son of Man? This will take a lot of deliberation, because most of us simply cannot imagine it. For the next 23 days, let us take this journey with young Mary and travel with her in her last month of pregnancy from her home all the way to Bethlehem. Can we conceive the concern and worries of Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne? Initially, they must have been terrified that she would be stoned for her indiscretion. How grateful they must have been that Joseph was such a great man of integrity, and most importantly, that he believed! Imagine further, their terror for Mary and Joseph, travelling so great a distance as Mary's delivery date quickly approached.

Can we conceive the trust, hope, and belief the Three Kings must have had to leave the gilded, extravagant life style they were accustomed to, to follow a star? Envision their journey through inhospitable lands to reach an unknown destination. Imagine their faith!

Let us spend the month of December this year, not worrying about the tree, the gifts, and the cost. Let us think and pray instead that we are ready when Mary says, "Joseph, Joseph, the baby is coming!"

Mrs. Luthy Library:


