From the Principal's Desk

November 1, 2016

Hello Parents and Guardians,

In a homily shared last week, the priest shared the following story. There was as second grade student...

Billy was in class and suddenly realized his pants were wet and there was dripping down his leg. Mortified when he realized he had wet his pants, something he had never done before, he laid his head down on the desk and prayed to God..."Help me, God, because my life as I know it is over. All my friends are going to laugh at me and all the girls in the class will never want to have anything to do with me every again." As he is contemplating what to do next, Sally, his classmate, starts down the aisle holding the fishbowl and trips right next to him, spilling the contents all over Billy's lap.

The class reacts with screaming, mostly directed to Sally for her clumsiness and reach out in Billy's defense. The teacher sends Billy to the office with another child in search of a pair of gym shorts to change into. Back in the classroom, students continue to chastise Sally for her stupidity. Later in the day, Billy went up to Sally and said, "You did that on purpose, didn't you?" to which she commented, "I wet my pants once too."

The empathy shown by Sally to her classmate is one of the primary elements of "Equipping Saints for Life", which is the forefront of Catholic education. It is important to visit this idea as we prepare to celebrate All Saints Day. In our recent readings at mass, there has been a lot of attention paid to the Pharisees' behavior. Their efforts to bring attention to themselves is not lost on Jesus, but we are reminded that what God is looking for in us is not a comparison of our behavior, sacrifice, and interactions with our fellow man (including virtual interactions), but a comparison of our actions to His expectations of us as defined by the Ten Commandments and Beatitudes. While we fluff our feathers with pride in our donations to the poor, our attendance in mass, and how great our children do in school, might God be looking more at our interactions with the less fortunate, how we treat each other when we are leaving the parking lots at church and school, and how we nurture the sense of empathy and compassion in our children and ourselves?

Today as we honor the Saints who went before us, let us take some time to think about how we can join their ranks and guide our children in that path as well. You have all made a very important step in that direction by choosing Catholic education, a choice we are most appreciative of. Please help us in equipping your children to be Saints by modelling the attributes of Saint Theresa, "Stay where you are, find your own Calcutta, find the sick, the suffering, and the lonely right where you are"...you won't have to look far.

Letter from The Governing Board of Pastors

Monsignor Sangermano—Pastor of Holy Saviour Parish

PURGATORY: GOD'S GREAT GIFT OF MERCY

The month of November, at the beginning of which we commemorate All the Faithful Departed, on what we commonly call All Souls Day, is the time the Church asks us in a special way to dwell upon the reality of the state of purification after death, which is commonly called Purgatory.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches the following concerning this state: “All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name *Purgatory* to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire. This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: 'Therefore [Judas Macca-beus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin.' From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. (CCC, 1030)”

The reality of Purgatory also makes a great deal of sense! We know that God's mercy permits what is called “final penitence,” or “final conversion.” We learned as children that, even to a person's last breath, God permits even an internal act of sorrow for sin, to save even a great sinner from eternal damnation. However, our sense of justice also demands that there still be some purification of the remnants of sin. The idea of the saintly person, dying after living a life of great holiness, and the great sinner, saved at the last moment by God's mercy, seems to demand some means of equity. This is “common sense,” which is also a participation in God's sense of knowledge and justice. Hence, the state of purification after death, known as Purgatory. This is not a mere “devotion” or pious thought: it is part of the Church's revealed truth.

Unfortunately, in our own day, when it seems that everyone is “emotionally canonized” at death, the dead are often deprived of the prayers they need. The bond that exists among the Church on earth, working towards salvation, the Church in Heaven having reached that salvation and now assisting us, and the Church Suffering, those in Purgatory who need our prayers, is a beautiful one. It shows how we are all connected to one another in Christ. This means we can help each other, not only on earth, but even after death! Pray for your beloved who have died, pray for all the souls in Purgatory, especially those who have no one to pray for them. One day, your welcome into Heaven will be even greater, because they will be there to greet you!



Tuition Assistance Opportunities for Holy Rosary Families



There are several sources of tuition assistance available to Holy Rosary families. These opportunities are made possible through the generous support of various businesses and foundations. A number of these opportunities require interested families to go through an outside application process. Other opportunities become available because of direct donations to Holy Rosary from generous parishioners of affiliated parishes.

The available opportunities and related application processes are outlined below. In cases in which Holy Rosary decides who the recipients will be, Holy Rosary will only consider families that have completed the application process for all funding sources for which they would qualify. Any cases of extraordinary or unforeseen circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

EITC & OSTC FUNDS

Much of the available tuition assistance is made possible through **Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC)** and **Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC)** business donations to non-profit organizations interested in promoting education. To be eligible for EITC or OSTC funding for the 2015-2016 school year the adjusted gross income for a family with one dependent must be \$90,000 or less. For each additional dependent, the adjusted gross income threshold increases \$15,000. Below is a listing of the organizations that provide EITC & OSTC funding to Holy Rosary students and an explanation of how to apply for funding from each organization. Please note: all eligible families do not necessarily receive funding. Awards are dependent on the amount of scholarship money available each year.

Business Leadership Organized for Catholic Schools (BLOCS) is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping families afford Catholic education. Holy Rosary students received almost \$19,000 in BLOCS funding during the 2015-2016 school year.

BLOCS applications for the 2016-2017 school year will be available in the fall at www.blocs.org.

Tuition Assistance for Holy Rosary Families

The Bridge Foundation is an independent non-profit organization that provides scholarship opportunities to Pennsylvania low-income families. Families must apply directly to the Bridge Foundation between May 1st and June 30th each year. Applications are only accepted during this window. Applications are available online at www.bridgeedu.org. Families who receive Bridge funding must complete a 40-hour community service requirement.

The Henkels Foundation supports benevolent, religious, educational, charitable, scientific, and literary undertakings throughout the United States.

If funds become available through the Foundation, Holy Rosary determines how to distribute the funding. Only families that have completed the BLOCS application, and who meet the eligibility requirements for EITC funding, will be considered for available Henkels funds.

Other Funding Sources

The Kremer Foundation provides Catholic elementary schools with tuition grants for children from financially challenged families. The Foundation's grants are given directly to the schools; school principals select which students receive the tuition assistance. Holy Rosary received \$10,000 from the Kremer Foundation for the 2014-2015 school year.

To qualify for assistance, a family's adjusted gross income cannot exceed the federal food program's maximum family income for reduced priced meals. The 2016-2017 guidelines are not yet available. To qualify for the 2015-2016 school year, a family of four's adjusted gross income had to be less than \$43,568; the qualifying amount was increased by \$7,437 for each additional family member.

If Holy Rosary receives a grant from the Kremer Foundation for the 2016-2017 school year, Holy Rosary will notify families of the application process in the spring. All applications will be submitted to Holy Rosary.

Children's Scholarship Fund (CSF) provides scholarships to qualifying families who live in Philadelphia to fund tuition at a private school of the family's choosing. PLEASE NOTE: Families must reside in Philadelphia to qualify; students may attend a CSF-approved school outside the Philadelphia city limits. Income eligibility requirements will be available on the CSF website www.csphiladelphia.org when they become available.

Applications will be available on the website in mid-November and are due no later than March 1. Scholarships are awarded by random lottery. Recipients are notified by mid-March.
